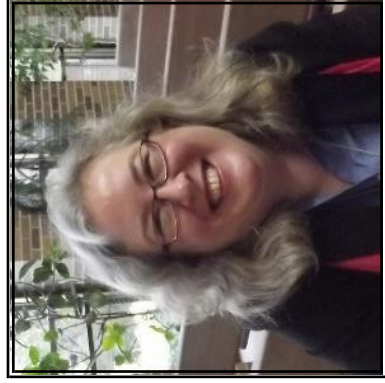

Camp de Benneville Pines, a UU owned camp, has been a home away from home for generations of campers since the 1960's, and now it welcomes you! Nestled 6,800 feet up in the San Bernardino Mountains, the camp is surrounded by mature oaks, pines, and cedar trees.

Lodgings are comfortably rustic, with shared bathroom facilities, hot showers and heated rooms. Cabins sleep four to six per room. Deluxe accommodations are Cabin Six and Craig's Cabin; each includes a communal kitchen and living room area. Delicious meals are prepared and served in main Homet lodge, with vegan, vegetarian, and gluten-free options available upon request. Camp facilities also include an archery range, basketball half-court, volleyball court, playground, heated swimming pool (in season), hot tub, and wilderness hiking trails.



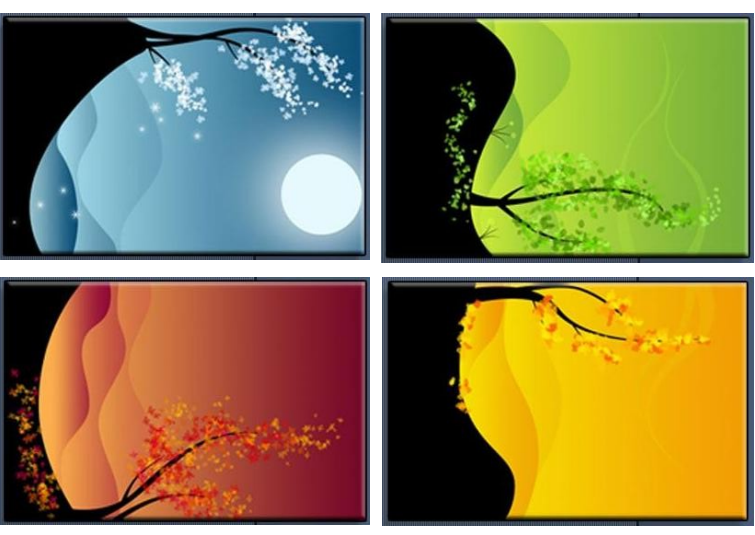
