Camp de Benneville Pines has been a home away from home for generations of UU campers since the 1960's, and now it welcomes you! Nestled 6,800 feet up in the San Bernardino Mountains, the camp sits surrounded by oaks, ponderosa pines, and cedar trees.

Lodgings are comfortably rustic, with shared bathrooms in each building. Cabin rooms sleep 2 - 3 people on bottom beds. Upper bunks are available to those who wish to use them.

Deluxe accommodations in Cabin Six and Craig's Cabin include a communal kitchen and living room area.

Delicious meals are prepared and served in Homet lodge, with vegetarian, vegan, and gluten-free options available upon request.

Camp facilities also include an archery range, basketball half-court, volleyball court, heated Olympic-sized pool, and hot tub.

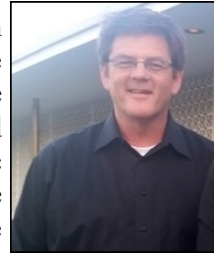
Singing In the Pines will run concurrently with Camp “Summer Break”, so bring along your non-musical friends for 4 days of fun in the mountains!

Sessions will focus on music suitable for use in UU worship. Participants are encouraged to bring their favorite songs to share with the group (original music welcome). Team up with others to create new music! Perform in concert on the final evening of camp. If you are a director looking for repertoire for your church, a choir member looking to dedicate four days to singing, or perhaps a songwriter/musician looking to become more deeply involved in UU music, then this camp is for you!

If you have been looking to open your heart to music, commune with others, and yearn to connect with the divine, come add your voice at “Singing in the Pines”.

Facilitator Scott Roewe began playing music around the time he could sit up straight, playing the bongos while his mother played piano. He went on to write music for the hit television show Rescue 911, and helped with the production of music for the top ranked TV show, CSI. Scott was a recording artist signed to Geffen Records with the band Wild Colonials, and has edited music videos for artists such as Lenny Kravitz and Celine Dion. His mother also took him to Sunday school at the UU church in Wilmington, Delaware, and now he works as music director at the UU Church in Santa Clarita, California. Scott teaches music at New Roads High School in Santa Monica, California. Scott brings his passion for music, people, and community to Singing in the Pines by helping to organize the event, singing with the choir, playing various instruments, and leading salsa dance classes.



Choir Director Reverend Kellie Walker Hart embraces the divine in herself, and in doing so, she illuminates the divine in others. She does this through sharing music. Having received her M.A. in Musical Therapy, this gift appears to be quite effortless to Kellie. Nearly 25 years ago, Kellie began working at Valley UU Congregation in Chandler, Arizona. She started as a volunteer and was ultimately ordained as Minister of Music by the congregation in 2011. In this role, Kellie oversees all music for Sunday worship services and directs a 45-voice choir. Kellie works to continually expand VUU’s music outreach program, including the Voices Lifted singers, and activities such as toddler music classes for parents and children. Kellie says helping people find the courage to sing is one of the most rewarding parts of her job.
